Keep your kids safe online

When your kids start to interact on the Internet -- playing games, watching YouTube videos, socializing in virtual worlds, getting homework help, and searching on Google -- you may feel that you're losing control over your kids' world.

The best way to 'wrap your arms' around your kids' online activities is to spend some time with them while they're visiting their favourite sites. Talk with them about what they like and what they don't.

Why Internet safety matters

Kids today can go online from so many different sources, including video game consoles, iPhones and smart phones, and even handheld gaming devices. Young people are increasingly living their lives online, and their digital devices are some of their favourite toys and tools.

Shouldn't this new playground be a safe and nice place? With your guidance, it can be. Teaching internet safety early will have lasting rewards for you and your kids.

Internet Safety Basics

Help your kids understand that they should:

- Never share their names, schools, ages, phone numbers, or addresses;
- Never send pictures to strangers;
- Keep passwords private (except to parents);
- Never open email from strangers it may contain viruses that can harm a computer; and
- Immediately tell an adult if something mean or creepy happens.

Strategies for a responsible -- and safer -- online life

- **Visit only age-appropriate sites.** Check out the site before your kids visit it. Know what features and what content exist and make sure they're good for your kids.
- **Search safely.** Use safe search settings for young kids or think about applying filtering software to limit inappropriate exposure.
- **Avoid strangers.** Tell your kids that people aren't always who they say they are in cyberspace. Explain that if someone they don't know talks to them, they shouldn't respond but should let you know.

- **Be a good cyber citizen!** Remind kids that an Internet playground is still a playground and they need to play nicely. A good rule of thumb: If they wouldn't do something in real life, they shouldn't do it online. Find out how your children can report mean behaviour or unkind content on their favourite sites and teach them how to do it.
- Online cheating? It's still cheating and it's a no-no pure and simple.
- Keep the computer in a central place. So you can see what's going on.
- **Establish expectations and limits** about the amount of time your children spend online and what they do. Create a family media agreement for the amount of time spent on line.
- View your own habits carefully. You are their role models.

But, mostly, be involved and have fun with them! Keeping kids safe and teaching them how to use digital technology responsibly is all about staying involved. Start by showing interest in the sites they visit and the games they play and your job will be a lot easier when they start exploring these technologies more independently.

Children who need to leave the school during school hours (eg: for appointments with doctor, dentist etc) need to be signed out at the school office by the parent/carer and then signed in when they return to school from their appointment.

Change of Contact Details

Please notify the school of any changes to contact details including changes to emergency details and medication conditions.

Christmas Concert 2022


This term students are excitedly preparing for this year's Christmas Concert on Thursday, December 8, starting from 5.30pm.

SENSATIONAL SCIENCE

Term 4 is all about Earth and Space for our St Lawrence Scientists. Across year groups, students are exploring the Solar System and Earth's relationship with the Sun and Moon. As well as, becoming experts on our Weather Systems, Earth's Atmosphere, Natural Disasters and our Earth itself, specifically soils and rocks and how our sky and landforms have changed over time.

I've found that our young learners are quite inquisitive when it comes to this unit of study. And many share in lessons prior knowledge from their personal interests in Space.

To further our learning, Space Week was celebrated at the commencement of the term, and students were given the opportunity to consider "If I Were An Astronaut…" as well as express their personal wonders of our Earth, Space and Beyond.

Bringing Science into our homes, we experienced a Total Lunar Eclipse last week, something we won't see again until March 2025. Many students, across all year levels, described eye-witness accounts of our sky the evening of November 8, 2022, including photos and videos taken from their own backyards.

This has been a fun and exciting unit of study to round out Science for 2022 at St Lawrence.
