Home Learning Tip

Home Learning Cyber Safety

The internet provides an opportunity for children to interact and learn on a global scale. However the internet also provides complete strangers with a direct line into your home, and your child's life. This cannot be underestimated, so you need to educate yourself and your child about the potential dangers.

Some simple strategies can be implemented including setting strict rules for usage and regular supervision in order to ensure they are being adhered to:

2 Have your computer set up in a family area so it must be used openly

- 2 Set time limits and identify sites permitted for visiting
- 2 Teach your child not to open mail from unknown sources
- 2 Encourage students to use an anonymous, online name that is not gender specific
- Be vigilant about only using a webcam under supervision

I Encourage your children to come to you if they encounter any inappropriate or disturbing content that makes them feel uncomfortable

Numerous apps can be installed on your devices that limit access to different functionalities, apps, and the internet etc. They give you the control to automatically limit their use or turn them off completely. At school we employ Zulu Desk for this purpose. I strongly encourage you to look into these options and decide as a family what would work best for you.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS NEWS

LITERACY SUPPORT

We have been using the MiniLit program at St Lawrence for the past two years, in conjunction with the Levelled Literacy Intervention (LLI) programme. MiniLit is a special teaching programme with carefully structured and sequenced lessons. The programme is designed for students in the junior years who are experiencing difficulty learning to read. MiniLit is offered in small groups and aims to help students to catch up to their peers. The programme runs across several terms, depending on the needs of the students.

Each lesson has 3 main components:

- Sounds and Words Activities: This is where students learn to pay attention to different sounds in words and to associate them with the letters of the alphabet
- Text Reading: This provides students with the chance to practise their new reading skills with support.
- Shared Story Book Reading: This involves the teacher reading and discussing a story book with the students, focusing on building vocabulary, comprehension and reading behaviours.

PARENTS & FRIENDS

The P&F have recently provided the funds to purchase the MacqLit programme, this programme follows on from MiniLit. It is a special programme designed for students in Year 3 and above who are in need of support with their reading and spelling. MacqLit is offered to small groups of students and follows a sequence of carefully structured lessons. The aim of the programme is to help students who are struggling to catch up to their peers. MacqLit runs across several terms, depending on the needs of the students.

MacqLit students will:

- Practise reading with 1:1 support
- Focus on learning how to read and spell words using appropriate and explicit strategies
- Have regular support to develop greater independence when reading and to improve their reading accuracy, fluency and comprehension.


SCHOOL DISCO
