Easter is a message of hope, a reminder that Christ died and rose again for each one of us.

We will soon enter Holy Week, a week commemorating Jesus' last week on earth and the events leading up to His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The fourteen stations focus on specific events on His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The Stations of the Cross are commonly found in churches as a series of 14 icons or images.

This week our Year 4 students participated in a beautiful reflection through the Stations of the Cross.



Our Year 4 students' re-enactment of the Stations of the Cross was performed reverently and helped them connect with the sense of love, sacrifice and commitment to faith that was demonstrated by Jesus during these events. # COVID-19 UPDATE

### **COVID-19 Self-Reporting and school holidays**

We encourage families to continue to enter their children's COVID-19 positive onto the Self-Reporting Portal located on our school website over the course of the school holidays. Doing so will allow for the Leadership Team to have a complete picture of students who have been COVID-19 positive and therefore who are no longer able to be determined as close contacts or deemed susceptible to the virus.

It is important to note that if parents are using the self-reporting portal to report a positive RAT result that they must also record the positive test result on the Healthy WA website. <a href="https://www.healthywa.wa.gov.au/ratregister">https://www.healthywa.wa.gov.au/ratregister</a>. Please notify a positive result via the Healthy WA website prior to entering this information on the Self-Reporting Form. Thank you for your understanding.

### **School Operating Guidelines Term 2**

Schools throughout WA are currently operating within the WA Health guidelines. In line with the latest advice from the Chief Health Officer, arrangements at St Lawrence have been reviewed for term two. Please note the following:

### **Parents on School Sites**

Parents/caregivers will now be allowed on the school site for the following purposes:

### Pick up/Drop off

 Parents can now enter the school site to drop off and pick up their children but must remain outdoors. Parents/Caregivers attending school sites must adhere to physical distancing requirements.

#### **Assemblies**

Assemblies are allowed under the following conditions:

- Limited to a single year group only.
- Parents may attend year group assemblies provided they comply with mask wearing and physical distancing requirements.
- Children identified as close contacts will not be able to attend assemblies. Alternative arrangements will be made for these children, so they do not feel excluded.

### Large one-off events

• May continue but will need to adhere to mask wearing, physical distancing, venue capacity and density limits.

#### Masks

Students from Year 3 and above must continue to wear a mask unless:

- They have a medical certificate
- They are communicating with a person who is deaf or hard of hearing, and visibility of the mouth is essential for communication.
- They are engaged in physical activity, including physical education classes and organised sport.
- They are consuming food, drink, or medicine.

Masks are encouraged but not required for students in Kindergarten to Year 2 based on advice from the Chief Health Officer. All information regarding COVID-19 and our procedures are subject to change so please continue to check your emails, the school newsletter and the school website for updated information.

### **School Uniform**

A reminder to all parents that next term all students are required to be in winter uniform. To assist parents and students in this transition, a two-week change-over period will be permitted. All students are required to be in full winter uniform by the commencement of Week 3.

We have a uniform dress code at St Lawrence as we believe it reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school.

We have noticed an increase in children recently who are not wearing the correct uniform. There has also been an increasing number of children with haircuts that are becoming more extreme. Please ensure that your child's hair is appropriately cut and that if hair is shoulder length or longer or if it falls about the face that it is tied back. Hair ties should be in the school colours only: Blue or white with the summer uniform, navy blue or white with the winter uniform and gold or red with the sports uniform. Please ensure that the only jewellery worn is:

- Plain small sleepers or small gold, silver or small stone studs, only one per ear.
- One cross or Christian religious medal on a chain tucked under the shirt/blouse may be worn. No rings or bracelets to be worn.

The resurrection of Your Son has given us new life and renewed hope.


Help us to live as new people in pursuit of the Christian ideal.

### **GIRLS/BOYS**

- Jumpers or a school vest may be worn with school uniform only.
- Sports Track Jacket only to be worn with sports uniform

- Boys blue shirt is worn for summer and winter uniform and must be tucked in school grey trousers.
