Dear St Lawrence School Community

Welcome to Wellness Week. Our students have been running afternoon movement activities for the school to highlight the importance of exercise. Staff are also very excited that our regular afternoon Professional Learning Community Meeting is replaced with Yoga and a Staff Social Event.

We all lead busy lives and hold multiple responsibilities. In giving so much of ourselves to others, we can reflect on the example of Jesus, who modelled for us the need to take time off. Jesus took time off too.

Changes to DROP OFF and PICK UP Procedures

With restrictions for the COVID pandemic easing to Baseline Guidelines our school is close to operating as per usual. This means we are now able to return to pre COVID drop off and pick up procedures. The usual procedures will come into effect next week, commencing Monday 30 May. Contained further on in this newsletter is an explanation taken from our most recent parent handbook.

In summary, these are the changes:

- The Church Drive Through Lane **is not** available for morning drop off. It is only available for afternoon pick up for families L-Z.
- Drop off lane <u>is not</u> available to Pre Kindy, Kindergarten and Pre Primary children. These children must be escorted into their classroom by parents or guardians.
- Pick up lane **is not** available for Pre Kindy and Kindergarten. These children must be collected by their parent or guardian.
- The two gates which students may enter the school grounds are either at the entrance to the School Administration or at the corner of the Year 1 Classroom.

In addition, the below changes have been introduced:

- The Junior Oval is recommended for parents of Pre Kindy, Kindy and Pre Primary Students.
- Children are collected from the steps of the Church Drive Through, not on the lawn area.

I would like to take this time to remind all families "No child is permitted to walk through either car park without a parent or guardian."

Many thanks to all our staff who have spent many hours in the rain, hail or sunshine over the past two years to support COVID guidelines to minimise the impact of the virus.

These restrictions prevented parents being able to enter school grounds, particularly in our early childhood. We look forward to strengthening the home and school interaction, particularly for our littlest learners in early childhood.

NATIONAL SIMULTANEOUS STORY TIME

Today is National Simultaneous Story time. At 9.00am WST schools across the nation had the same story read to a group of students. I was very fortunate to be the Guest Speaker for our Year 1 Class. This year's chosen novel was Family Tree, written by Josh Pyke and beautifully illustrated by Ronojoy Ghosh.

Family Tree is a heartfelt celebration of family, community and the seasons of life to cherish and to share. I was so impressed with how our Year One Children engaged with the story and made personal connections with their own lives. Children understood the sadness of when children become older and move away from their mums and dads and recalled the comfort they received from parents during the recent storms. We acknowledge and value diversity of our families. All families are different and should be celebrated.

SCHOOL PARKING PROCEDURES

1. Vehicles are to enter the Netball Courts near the church and exit the netball courts near the school.

Vehicles are able to park on the Netball Courts and the Junior Oval. We recommend the Junior Oval for parents with Pre Kindy, Kindergarten and Pre Primary Students.

DRIVE THROUGH LANE

2. Drivers are to allow space, approximately one car width, at the eastern end of the car park, thus allowing for other drivers to depart from car bays and proceed to the Junior Oval.

3. MORNING DROP OFF: (Driver must stay in the car)

- a. Enter via **IN** ramp.
- b. Continue driving on the netball court to the far end outside Year 2 classroom.
- c. **Drop off** passengers from lawn area in front of the Administration Block.
- d. Depart via **OUT** ramp onto Albert Street.

PRE PRIMARY DROP OFF

Children must be escorted to the classroom by their parents or guardian. Children are not to walk through the carpark or on the Junior Oval unsupervised.

PRE KINDY / KINDERGARTEN DROP OFF

Children must be dropped off and collected by an adult, therefore parents are asked to park their cars on the netball court. Children are not to walk through the carpark or on the Junior Oval unsupervised.

AFTERNOON PICK UP

4. <u>Pickup area for Families whose surname starts with A-K</u>

(Driver must stay in the car)

- a. Enter via IN ramp KEEP RIGHT.
- b. Continue driving on the netball court to the far end outside Year 2 classroom.
- c. Pick up passengers from in front of the Administration Block.
- d. Depart via OUT ramp onto Albert Street.

5. <u>Pickup area for Families whose surname starts with L-Z</u>

(Driver must stay in the car)

- a. Enter via IN ramp KEEP LEFT.
- b. Continue UP the ramp to the Junior Oval level.
- c. Proceed to the front of the church. Pick up passengers from the Church steps.
- d. Exit via driveway between the Church and the Alverna Centre
- e. The speed limit within the carpark is 5-10km/hour
- 6. Parents wishing to park or leave their vehicle:
 - a. Enter via IN ramp.
 - b. Park either against fence near church or in TWO rows in the middle of the Netball Courts. (Please minimise gaps in between cars so maximum number cars are able to be parked.)
 - c. The netball area near the fence outside the Year 2 classroom must be left free for traffic flow.
 - e. The driver must leave the vehicle as NO child is allowed onto the Netball court between 2.55pm 3.30pm unless accompanied by an adult.

- 7. People who arrive early at St Lawrence (before 2.45p.m.) need to park their cars in the designated parking areas **AND NOT WAIT IN THE DRIVE THROUGH LANE**. This causes an unnecessary bank up of traffic, which then restricts access to the school grounds, blocks traffic on Albert Street and creates a "grid-lock" situation.
- 8. Avoid illegal acts such as double parking, parking on footpaths, or unsafe practices such as stopping in the traffic flow areas, which will endanger your child/children. Father has asked that parents refrain from parking near the front of the Church as parishioners who attend morning Mass need clear access.
- 9. Be on the alert for children who may not be looking for moving vehicles.
- **10**. If your child is going home with another family they are to wait with the children from that family.

PRE-PRIMARY PICK UP

Parents or guardians may park and collect their child from the classroom from 2.45pm onwards. Should you wish to use the drive-through facility, you will need to advise the class teacher that your child will be picked-up at the lawn area outside the school office. Those children who need to move to the lawn area for collection will be escorted and supervised from 2.45pm to 3.10pm by a staff member.

Older siblings who wish to sit with their Pre-Primary brother or sister, may do so under the supervision of the Teacher Assistant with the Pre Primary Students. Once the parent or guardian arrives at the drive through then the Teacher Assistant will release the Pre-Primary child. After 3.10pm any remaining Pre-Primary or Year One children will be brought into the office and may be collected by older siblings upon the parent or guardian's arrival.

PRE KINDY / KINDERGARTEN PICK UP

Pre Kindy children can be collected at 2.40pm and Kindy children can be collected at 2.40pm. Children must be dropped off and collected by an adult, therefore parents are asked to park their cars on the netball court or on the Junior Oval.

To reduce congestion in the car park please consider some of the following options:

- **Car pool** with another family.
- Have your child **ride their bike** to school. All bikes are safely secured during the day in the staff courtyard. Children must wear safety helmets.
- Walk to school.
- Walking Bus if you live close walk with a couple of families and parents can take turn being "Walking Bus Drivers".
- Drop children off at 8.30 a.m. Classrooms are opened at 8.30 a.m. and teachers are inside supervising.
- Pick up a little later. Instead of coming at 3.00pm. when it is very congested come at 3.05pm. Teacher supervision is from 3.00pm.to 3.15pm.
- Consider parking on the roadside of Albert Street and drop off/collect your children from the lawn area outside the Admin Building.
- Park in the bays near the Alverna Centre
- Consider using the drop off/pickup lane instead of parking.
- Consider parking only if you are on roster, or need to visit the office, classrooms etc. This would leave more parking bays for Pre-Kindy, Kindy and Pre Primary parents who are required to park and must walk their children up to Pre-Kindy, Kindy and Pre Primary

SCHOOL PHOTOS

The Pre-Kindy class will have their photos on Thursday. Children from Year 1 to 6 will need to be in their full winter uniform with their school jumper (No vest). Year 6 students will wear their leavers jacket. Children with long hair must have their hair tied up with blue or white accessories. Pre-Primary will need to wear their sports uniform.

WINTER UNIFORM

Please note the following uniform regulations:

"GIRLS/BOYS"

- Girls White Blouse is worn over skirt (not tucked in).

- Jumpers or a school vest may be worn with school uniform only.
- Sports Track Jacket only to be worn with sports uniform,
- Girls may wear navy tights with school uniform and purchased at any department store.
- Navy or white hair ties with school uniform and red or gold hair ties with sports uniform.
- Boys blue shirt is worn for summer and winter uniform and must be tucked in school grey trousers.
- Black school shoes with school uniform and all black sport shoes (no white soles or stripes) with sports uniform
