The Feast of St Martha occurs on the 29th of July. Martha is a wonderful example of the women who were close to Jesus during his lifetime.

"Jesus loved Martha and Mary and Lazarus." This unique statement in John's Gospel tells us of the special relationship Jesus had with Martha, her sister, and her brother.



Jesus was a frequent guest at Martha's home in Bethany, a small village two miles from Jerusalem. We read of three visits in Luke 10:38-42, John 11:1-53, and John 12:1-9. Many of us find it easy to identify with Martha in the story Luke tells. Martha welcomes Jesus and his disciples into her home and immediately goes to work to serve them. Hospitality is paramount in the Middle East and Martha believed in its importance. Imagine her frustration when her sister Mary ignores the rule of hospitality and Martha's work in order to sit and listen to Jesus.

Instead of speaking to her sister, she asks Jesus to intervene. Jesus' response is not unkind, which gives us an idea of his affection for her. He observes that Martha is worried about many things that distract her from really being present to him. He reminds her that there is only one thing that is truly important -- listening to him. And that is what Mary has done. In Martha, we see ourselves -- worried and distracted by all we have to do in the world and forgetting to spend time with Jesus. It is, however, comforting to note that Jesus loved her just the same. Jesus loves us to, even when we get very busy and fail to find the time to be with Him and listen to Him.

May we all find time to sit at the feet of Jesus and listen

CECWA Policy Implementation Transition

The new CECWA Policy and Executive Directives structure was promulgated throughout the Catholic Education System on 22 February 2021. All Catholic school principals must now lead the transition process, make sure any school-based policies are replaced by CECWA Policies and Executive Directives, with school-based procedures only being produced to provide additional guidance within their Catholic school community.

You will soon notice a change to our website with our policy page referring to Catholic Education Western Australia Ltd Policies. The purpose of this is to create clear consistent messaging on one platform with the embedded policy hub being a 'one stop shop' for all community members regardless of which Catholic school they attend. This page will continue to contain the most up-to-date policies and executive directives for your easy reference. The inclusion of this page does not in any way affect our current school operations.

I will keep you all informed as we move through this transition phase. Once finalised I will add any extra information to the Newsletter regarding our policies and procedures and the implications that are associated with following CEWA polices and St Lawrence procedures. The Team responsible for this transition are Ms Tranquille, Mrs Brennan, Mrs Boyle, Miss Fogliani and myself.

Home Learning Tip

Time playing outdoors does not have to be disconnected from the learning we do indoors. Children naturally notice so many things about nature – plants, sounds, textures, light, shadow – Observing their discoveries and expanding on them is a nice way to keep the focus on our child's interests and to scaffold on their learning.

We can also use what we find outdoors to create and learn with fun indoor nature activities as well. Often in the early years you will see a table loaded with pinecones, honky nuts, feathers, bark and stones. All-natural materials collected from outside. The children just love experimenting with them, talking to me about them, feeling their texture.

I cannot emphasize how much just getting outside for some free exploration and play benefits all of us! I think peace dwells in nature, and when kids are getting a bit stir-crazy, getting them outside settles that. It is amazing to watch the children play in the orchard, around the ovals, both junior and senior and see the wonderful make-believe worlds they create in their play. Play is where all learning comes from. Play is the natural basis of learning. Get the children outside and let them foster that natural desire to play and thus learn.




YEAR TWO

This year, the theme of Book Week is "Old Worlds, New Worlds, Other Worlds"


Over the next few weeks, I will feature some of the books that are part of the shortlist for the 2021 awards that we have as part of our library collection.
