



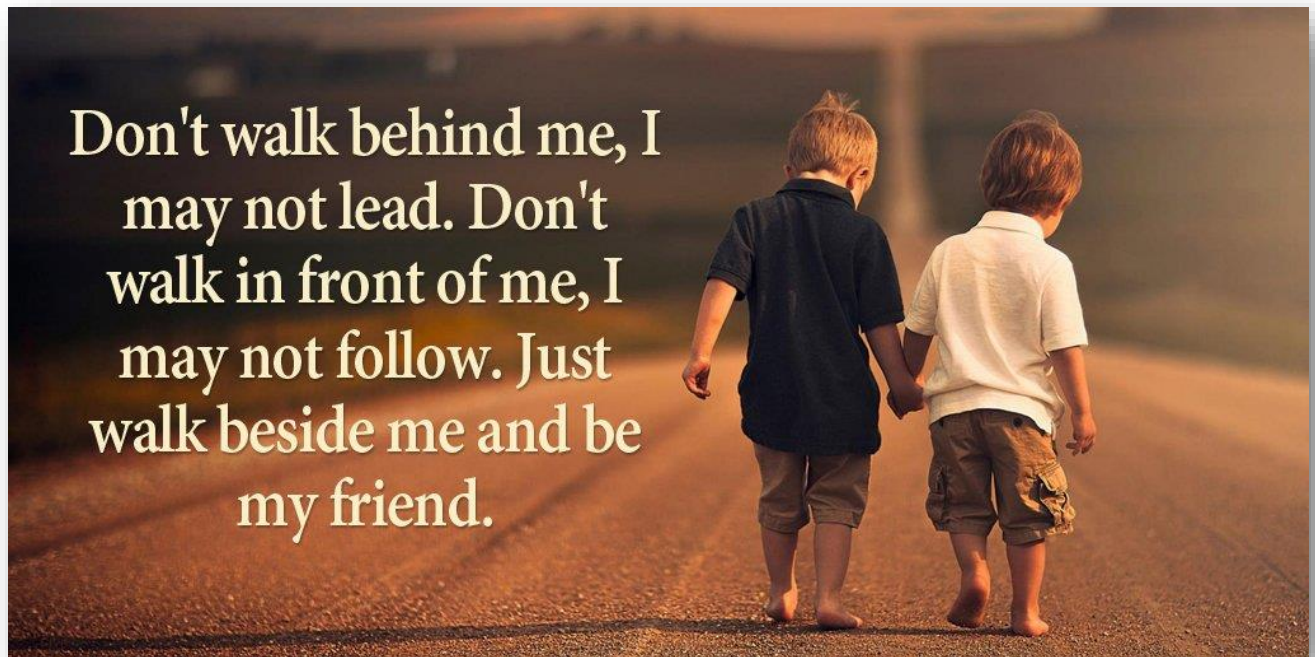

Catholic Pastoral Communities

Wellness Week for this Term is Week 6. We had embedded this wonderful initiative into our school term in an effort to support the wellness of our children and community members.

Wellness Week this term falls in Week Six. Students and families have a break from homework and instead focus on using that time to play some games, go for a walk, read together or watch a movie. Staff too share in this week by limiting the number of meetings and making sure that they also spend quality time with family and friends. We aim to generally support the emotional and mental health of all our community members.

During this week there are no meetings for teachers after school, and no homework for the children (reading shouldn't be seen as homework – just what we do for enjoyment). Please continue to read with your child each night. It is an opportunity for families to spend the time they would have dedicated to homework and other school centred activities and spend time with each other.

It provides a great opportunity to introduce “Reading Night” to your families - a night where the TV and other electronic devices get switched off and the family comes together to read, discuss books and share the joy of literature. Have a “screen free pledge night” with your children where you all pledge a night free of screen time, that so encroaches our lives, perhaps go for a family walk or midweek picnic, visit other family members like grand mum and dad that you don't normally catch up with midweek. Have a family cooking night! Maybe walk or ride your bike to school with the children. Plan healthy recess and lunches and prepare them with the children. It's all about our wellness and finding time to take care of our own health and wellbeing.

Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable

A reminder that we are bound by the local council parking regulations and restrictions. The council sends parking inspectors on a regular basis, and they do issue infringement notices and fines with regularity. These restrictions particularly apply to parking on the footpaths and paved area in front of the Church Car Parking and stopping in no-stopping zones. A reminder that all road laws apply to Albert Street including speed restrictions, using mobile phones while operating a vehicle etc. Regulations also apply to the land owned by the Church and School and as caretaker/custodian for those lands, I as principal, can apply added legal restrictions accordingly, as the land is privately owned. I ask that all users of the school lands abide by all road use laws and adhere to the added restrictions on parking and safety on this land. All these undertakings are in place for the safety and wellbeing of all community members and particularly the small children.

From time to time, I witness behaviour that certainly is not reflective of what I would hope from adults. These includes using a mobile phone while driving and speaking aggressively or disrespectfully to other road users. I ask you all to consider the appropriateness of all our reactions and behaviours and particularly the messages our choices as adults send to our children when they witness inappropriate actions. A huge note of gratitude and thanks you to the majority of families that always do the right things and set such good examples for us all to follow. Thank you all.

Active listening

Active listening is an important part of talking with your child and can encourage them to express how they are feeling. It helps them to feel that you understand what they are going through. Active listening involves the following steps:

Stop and give your child your full attention. This may involve moving away from a busy place where there are lots of other people. At a time when you cannot give your child your full attention (e.g. when caring for another child), let your child know that you want to listen and will give them your full attention after you finish. Prioritising time to listen actively to your child will help to show them that their feelings are important.

Look at your child. If possible, get down to their level to show them you are ready to listen.

Listen carefully to what is being said in words and through your child's body language without interrupting. Listening involves eye contact and nodding where appropriate.

Reflect the feeling. Use the opportunity to respond and gently describe what you think your child is feeling and why. This allows you to check if you have understood what your child is feeling.

We have several students who do not have any scissors in the classroom. This makes completing tasks challenging. Please ensure your child has all the necessary materials to complete their learning in Year Five.

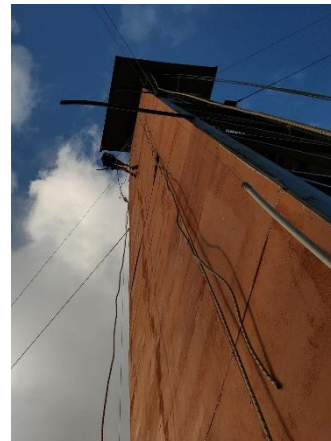
The Year Fives are looking forward to leading the Assembly on Friday.
