Dear Parents and Friends

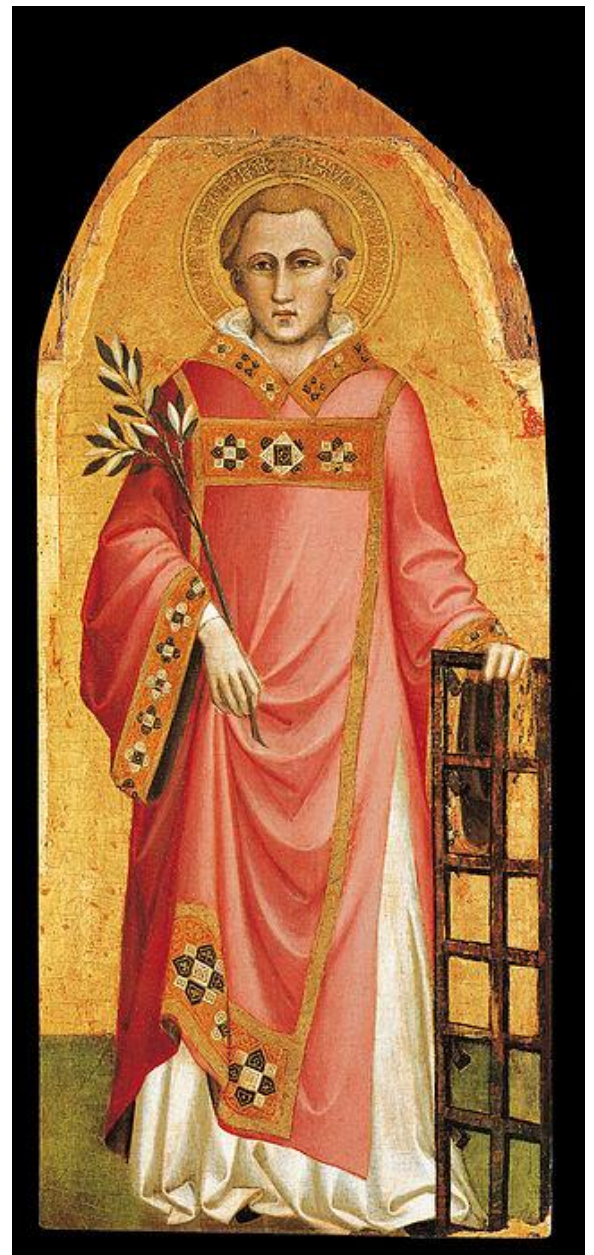
Saint Lawrence, (died 258, Rome Italy; feast day August 10), is one of the most venerated Roman martyrs of the Catholic Church. He is celebrated for his Christian valour and his great love of the poor. He is the patron saint of the poor and of cooks. Lawrence was among the seven deacons of the Roman church serving Pope Sixtus II, whose martyrdom preceded Lawrence's by a few days: they were executed during the persecution under the Roman emperor Valerian.

The emperor believed the Church to have great wealth in gold and silver and captured Lawrence asking for "all the treasure of the Church." It is said that Lawrence gave the church's treasures to the poor and the sick before his arrest. The emperor then asked for the treasures and Lawrence assembled all the poor and presented them to the emperor saying, "These are the treasures of the Church."

Although Lawrence was probably beheaded, St. Ambrose of Milan and the Latin poet Prudentius, among others, recorded that he was roasted to death on a gridiron, remarking to his torturers at one point, "I am cooked on that side; turn me over."

Many conversions to Christianity throughout Rome reportedly followed Lawrence's death, including those of several senators witnessing his execution. He is named in the canon of the Roman mass.

St Lawrence is our school's patron saint, and we are very proud of our traditions and association with the name of such a great man and saint. Through the intercessions of St Lawrence, I pray for the safety and wellbeing of you all.

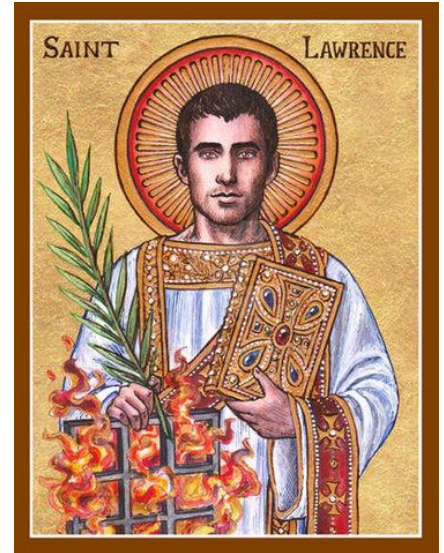
FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS

ST LAWRENCE SCHOOL FEAST DAY

COVID-19

As Premier Mark McGowan has recently communicated, WA is experiencing a rise in the number of cases of COVID-19 in the community. While the Chief Health Officer has said that this should not be cause for alarm, we are being encouraged to not become complacent in taking preventative measures to stop the spread of COVID-19.

BISHOPS RELIGIOUS LITERACY ASSESSMENT

The assessment for students in Years 3 and 5 will occur this week.

The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment is a curriculum-based assessment which reflects and supports the progressive nature of the K-12 Religious Education Units. It focuses on a student's ability to recall content about the Catholic Religion and assesses their knowledge and understanding of Religious Education, it does not measure a student's faith. The intended purpose of the assessment is to provide individual schools with a snapshot of student performance in Religious Education.

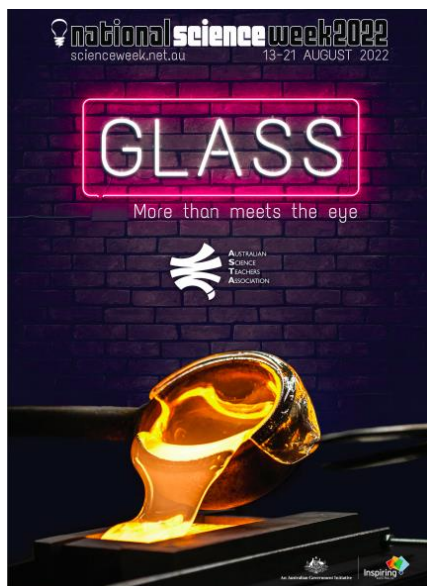

SENSATIONAL SCIENCE

Term 3 is all about Physical Science for our St Lawrence Scientists. Students in Year 1, 3 and 5 will explore Light and Sound in various ways; from what produces light and sound (Y1), how heat is produced/transferred (Y3), to exploring the behaviour of light (Y5). For students in Year P, 2, 4 and 6 it's all about forces – the focus of Movement (PP), Push & Pull (Y2), Magnets (Y4) and the various sources of Energy (Y6).



Watch This Space

Glass Inspired Science Activities, Teacher v Student Challenge, and an invitation to explore “Glass” in the world around us, as we celebrate National Science Week at St Lawrence Primary School in Week 5.

FACT: WHAT IS GLASS?

The glass used in windows and drinking glasses is made by heating and mixing silica (quartz sand) with limestone, soda ash and other ingredients, and then cooling it so quickly that an orderly crystal structure can't form.

Instead, the particles are spread out randomly. This gives glass its properties as a hard, yet brittle material with a smooth surface. From solar panels to phone screens, glass is manufactured into different shapes for a huge range of uses.
