Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders

As you are all aware our school operates under a number of mandated policies and procedures. In many cases, as I'm sure you know, enrolment is dependent upon adhering to these policies and procedures. Recently I have noticed a number of "hair cut" that are not compliant with our policies. I ask you all to ensure that you adhere to the correct policies and ensure our children are presented in accordance with requirements. I appreciate that styles of fashion come and go...however that does not negate our responsibilities to adhere to the requirements of our enrolment obligations. Thank you to all who are well presented and do adhere to these agreements.

Partnerships between parents and teachers are very important as together we support children through the many activities and experiences at school as well as at home – the following advice support this important partnership ensuring happy students doing well at school and at home.

- ◆ Start each day smoothly and peacefully with kind words, smiles and a hug. A child leaving a happy home starts the day in a happy frame of mind, the best pre-condition for good learning.
- ◆ Set aside time every day after school to spend with your children, hearing about their day, listening to what they are saying and paying them your full attention with no interruptions.
- ◆ Send your children to school with a nutritious breakfast inside them – one that includes protein, fruit and good carbohydrates. Pack nutritious, healthy and tasty food in their lunch so that they eat it all.
- ◆ Make sure they get plenty of sleep every night so their brains and bodies can grow.
- ◆ Use non-aggressive conflict resolution strategies so your children learn by example how to deal effectively with their anger and frustration with others. Help them learn to share and take their turn.
- ◆ Place a high value on good manners and respect for others and their property.
- ◆ Model and teach time management and organisational skills. Use calendars and planners for school and family life.
- ◆ Show your love of learning by going with them to the library, to concerts and art galleries. Fill your home with books.
- ◆ Talk with respect about teachers. Deal with any issues in private, not in front of your child.
- ◆ Encourage them to take responsibility for their own learning.

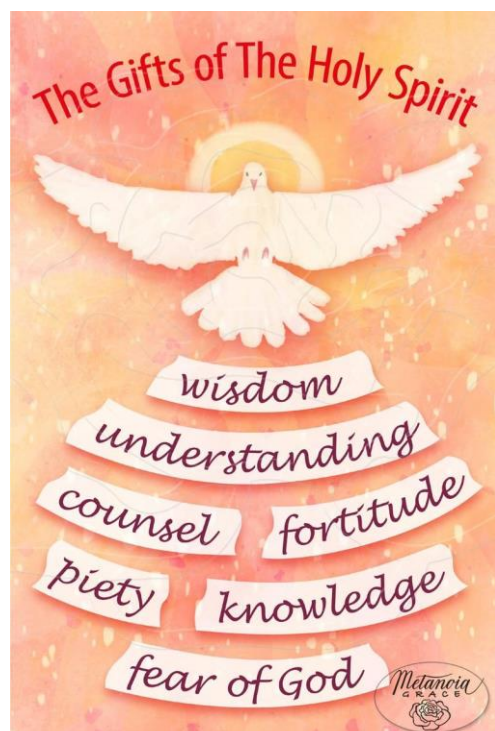
Students not returning in 2022

Home Learning Tip



Talk! Talk! Talk! • Talk about everyday things as you do them at home – sorting the washing, setting the dinner table, writing the shopping list. Point out things you see when out in the car, shopping or walking in the park. Talk about street signs, patterns, numbers on houses or cars, plants and animals. Play ‘I Spy’ together • It doesn’t matter if children don’t talk back at first, eventually they will! You can also start to ask questions like ‘which sock goes with this one?’ and ‘how many plates do we need on the table?’ Older children can then get involved in activities like sorting the washing or writing and reading the shopping list.

Help your child develop social skills. Children learn social skills by mixing with different people and trying new things with encouragement and praise. Talk to children about things they need to learn, ways they should act in different circumstances and what is expected of them when they are at home or outside of home (e.g., at the shops, at school). Help build independence, responsibility and skills for teamwork by involving them in shared family activities like preparing meals, setting the table, unpacking the shopping. Play team games helping them in taking turns in a game, understanding rules for a game, and resolving arguments without fighting. Provide encouragement and praise. Tell them what they are good at. Tell them when you are proud of them. Thank them for their helpfulness.

CLASS NEWS

PRE KINDY

Our days at Pre Kindy will now be very busy with many fun activities to complete inside and outside of the classroom.

A reminder that next Tuesday 26th October is the Kindergarten Parent Night at 6pm, with Mrs Rachel Wake.

Parent Interviews are continuing during this term so rest assured if you have not already met with me, I will make a time to see you over the coming weeks.

As your child is growing and more familiar with their classmates and teachers, I encourage you to discuss with them about speaking up and telling their teachers if they are not happy, if they need something or if other children may be upsetting them. It is important that they know they can trust their teachers to listen to them and to help sort out any worries in the classroom in a positive manner. It is so important to build their resilience in this way also. Next year they will be spending more time in school, and they need to have more independence as well as control in a satisfactory way. By having a good relationship with teachers, they will grow in confidence when difficulties may arise. Speaking up for themselves is an important life skill. We appreciate your support with this.

KINDERGARTEN

This week we are continuing to focus on the blue letter sounds ‘floubg’. We will also be moving on to blending three letter words (zipping the sounds together) by playing games such as a guess the word. I say “**C** (1 sec pause) **a** (1 sec pause) **t**” the child should respond “Cat!”. This takes time and will not always happen straight away. If your child is having trouble zipping the sounds together to make the word, then use less than 1 second pause to make it easier for them to guess the word. Slowly you want to make the pause longer, so they are really learning to blend the sounds together to make the word on their own.

Take Home Story Books went home yesterday, I hope you’re enjoying reading with your child each night. In Talk for Writing, we have been learning to orally retell the story Who Sank the Boat by Pamela Allen. The children have been amazing at thinking of new actions we could do to remind us of the way the story flows and are really enjoying this process! Have a wonderful week everyone!

PRE PRIMARY

We had some beautiful sunshine on Monday and the children made the most of it during outdoor play!

This week we have been hearing all about how we were given our names. This is part of our Religion program and the children have had so much fun hearing all about each other's names!

In Numeracy, we have been practicing counting forwards and backwards to 20 from any starting point. We will be introducing addition and using concrete materials to discuss 'how many altogether'! We will also look at how to write a number sentence. We have been practicing how to write our numbers and are getting so good at this! We are counting way past 100 now as we count how many days we have been at school - can you believe we have been learning for 148 days!

For shared reading this week, we are reading *The Fun Bus* by Jill Eccleston. It is a great story, and the children are engaging in many enjoyable literacy activities.

YEAR ONE

YEAR TWO



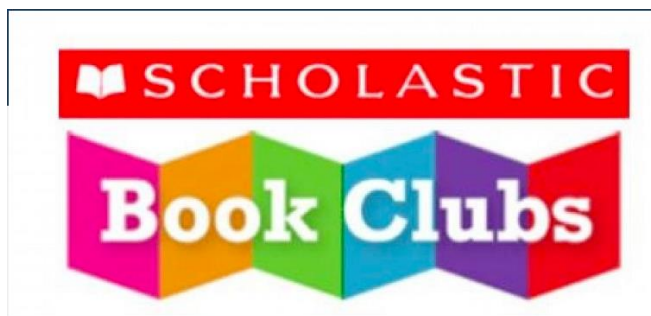
This Term in Science the children are studying about water. We will explore how they and others use water. Investigate where it comes from, how it is collected, transported, and accessed at school, at home, in the community and how to use it responsibly. They will observe, investigate and gather information to describe how water is an essential resource for life.

With the commencement of swimming next week and the talk of water, I have used this topic to launch our visual art program and asked the children to draw themselves floating in water.

We have spent a good bit of time thinking about how our hair and body look different when submerged under water. The children loved creating the look of weightlessness in their self-portraits.
