Mrs Brennan was ably supported by Ms Tranquille, our Assistant Principal and all the staff. We are very fortunate to have all our staff at St Lawrence. I have worked in numerous schools throughout my career and can honestly say a finer and more dedicated team of professional does not exist.

#### Catholic Schools of Excellence

Here at St Lawrence Primary, we provide many wonderful opportunities for our children to continue to come to know our Lord. Our Religious Education program includes many opportunities for children to strengthen their understandings of God and to ponder life's questions. Often formed in the mode of "wonder questions", where children are encouraged to ask questions and articulate their own wonderings about God. All our Gatherings, Assembles, Masses and Prayers lead our children to come closer to God. Visits by Father Emil and Father Adam also offer the children that deeper connection to God. As we develop a personal relationship with God, we are able to become more attuned to the working of the Lord in our own lives.

It is my personal long held belief that children are in fact masterful theologians. If we follow these definitions of theology:

**Theology** (from Greek Θεός meaning "god" and  $\lambda$ ογία, -logy, meaning "study of") is the systematic and rational study of concepts of deity and of the nature of religious truths, or the learned profession acquired by completing specialized training in religious studies.

Augustine of Hippo defined the Latin equivalent, *theologia*, as "reasoning or discussion concerning the Deity"; Richard Hooker defined "theology" in English as "the science of things divine"

When our children are talking about God, wondering in awe about God, articulating in their own words their understandings of the Divine. Then to my mind of thinking our children are in fact being theologians. It is the most special thing for me to listen to our little children tell me about God. You would be surprised what I have learnt from our students over the years about God, where He resides and how He is thinking and feeling. I was in our Three-Year-Old Kindy once when one of our children told me, and I quote. "God sits on my shoulder." Now I ask you, how precious is that inspired line of thinking that was articulated by a three-year-old.

#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS



We are currently working on the 2023 School Budget, finances, staffing, forward planning and the 2023 school year in general. If finalised staffing for the coming year is announced at the AGM. Reports from the School Advisory Council Chair, Treasurer, P&F President, Principal and Parish are presented at the AGM.

#### Catholic Pastoral Communities

I stumbled across this little image the other day... I thought it to be very apt...I often speak to our boys and girls about all our actions having consequences. The same applies to us as adults. All choices we make, all actions we take, all have consequences.

The food we eat, the exercise we do or don't do, the narratives we repeat, what we say about people, what we post on social media...all these choices, all have consequences.



Sometimes we unwittingly make choices that have very profound and negative consequences, but sometimes we make these choices and we have simply failed to appreciate the potential consequences of the action taken. My point being...we should always think things through. Make the wise choice, the informed choice, the choice that we are happy to live with the consequence of, whatever that may be.

## STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Our Student leadership model has been in place for three years now. Our boys and girls are busy preparing for their speeches and the election process. I include the following information taken from the Student Leadership Policy.

#### The Election Process:

- Each applicant must make a 2-minute maximum speech in the school hall to the Years 4 and 5 students and class teachers, Education Assistants and the Leadership Team.
- A bell will sound 30 seconds before concluding your speech.
- All speeches must be concluded within the 2-minute timeframe.
- The speech schedule will be as follows:

Day One – Faith Leaders

Day Two – Environmental Leaders

Day Three – Student Leaders

Day Four - Sport Leaders

- The new leaders will be announced at the End of the School Year.
- At the first mass of the following year the leadership badges will blessed and presented to the leaders.

#### **The Voting Process:**

- The election process will commence in Term 4.
- Years 3, 4,5 and 6 students and class teachers, Education Assistants and the Leadership Team will have the opportunity to vote for Environmental, Faith and Student Leaders.
- Students from Years 6, 5,4 and 3 from Faction groups will vote for Sport Leaders
- As with all matters in the school "The Principal will have the final say." The principal reserves the right to do so based on any grounds he/she perceives as relevant. These may be bound by privacy and confidentiality clauses.
- A digital voting slip will be created using Google Forms for each Leadership Role.
- An email will need to be sent to the co-ordinators with the list of candidates for each role.
- A link will be created and send to the Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 class teachers and the Leadership team.
- It is a requirement that Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 class teachers post this onto Teams so students can access the link. Students and staff will click on the link, tick the boxes of three candidates they would like to vote for and press submit.

#### **Conditions of Applying:**

The maximum number of leadership roles any student can apply for is two.

A student can only be appointed one leadership role.

SEQTA data and records will also be considered when judging the suitability of a candidate. (These may be bound by privacy and confidentiality laws.)

The Principal will have the final say and the right to appoint all school leaders.

If leaders lose their badge the cost of the replacement badge will be at their own cost.

### HOME LEARNING TIP

## **Cyber Safety**

The internet provides an opportunity for children to interact and learn on a global scale. However, the internet also provides complete strangers with a direct line into your home, and your child's life. This cannot be underestimated, so you need to educate yourself and your child about the potential dangers

Some simple strategies can be implemented including setting strict rules for usage and regular supervision in order to ensure they are being adhered to:

- ☐ Have your computer set up in a family area so it must be used openly
- $\square$  Set time limits and identify sites permitted for visiting
- ☐ Teach your child not to open mail from unknown sources
- $\hfill \Box$  Encourage students to use an anonymous, online name that is not gender specific
- $\hfill\Box$  Be vigilant about only using a webcam under supervision
- ☐ Encourage your children to come to you if they encounter any inappropriate or disturbing content that makes them feel uncomfortable

Numerous apps can be installed on your devices that limit access to different functionalities, apps, and the internet etc. They give you the control to automatically limit their use or turn them off completely. At school we employ Zulu Desk for this purpose. I strongly encourage you to look into these options and decide as a family what would work best for you.
