### **Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders**

Our Year Five children have been presenting their Leadership Speeches. I have attended the sessions and have seen the children flourish in their opportunities to participate in public speaking. Obviously not all students are successful in their attempts for formal leadership roles. That said all the children will have opportunities for leadership. This is part of the learning attached to such opportunities. We build resilience by how we learn to handle outcomes and events in childhood. Building resilience is aimed at giving children skills to face more difficulties and challenges later in life, to help to even the playing field. Each of us must learn how to handle the outcomes of events that happen throughout life. We build upon these skills, and this builds resilience. Many studies abound about our young adults lacking in the skills to handle life's setback. This is a concerning trend in society.

One of the reasons schools undertake such leadership programmes is for building resilience and setting up our boys and girls for success later in life, when disappointment and struggles will occur. The building blocks and scaffolding laid in childhood set the children up for success as they navigate the world as adults.

I commend all the boys and girls who put their hands up for a leadership position. I look forward to seeing the outcome of the voting procedure before I make my final decisions to endorse the candidates put forward by the process. As with all matters pertaining to the school, the principal has the final responsibility.

## **Catholic Schools of Excellence**

As you would be aware we have been in the process of replacing our old tile roof with Colourbond roofing. This has been funded by monies put aside over a number of years to ensure our school buildings are well maintained and in tip top condition. 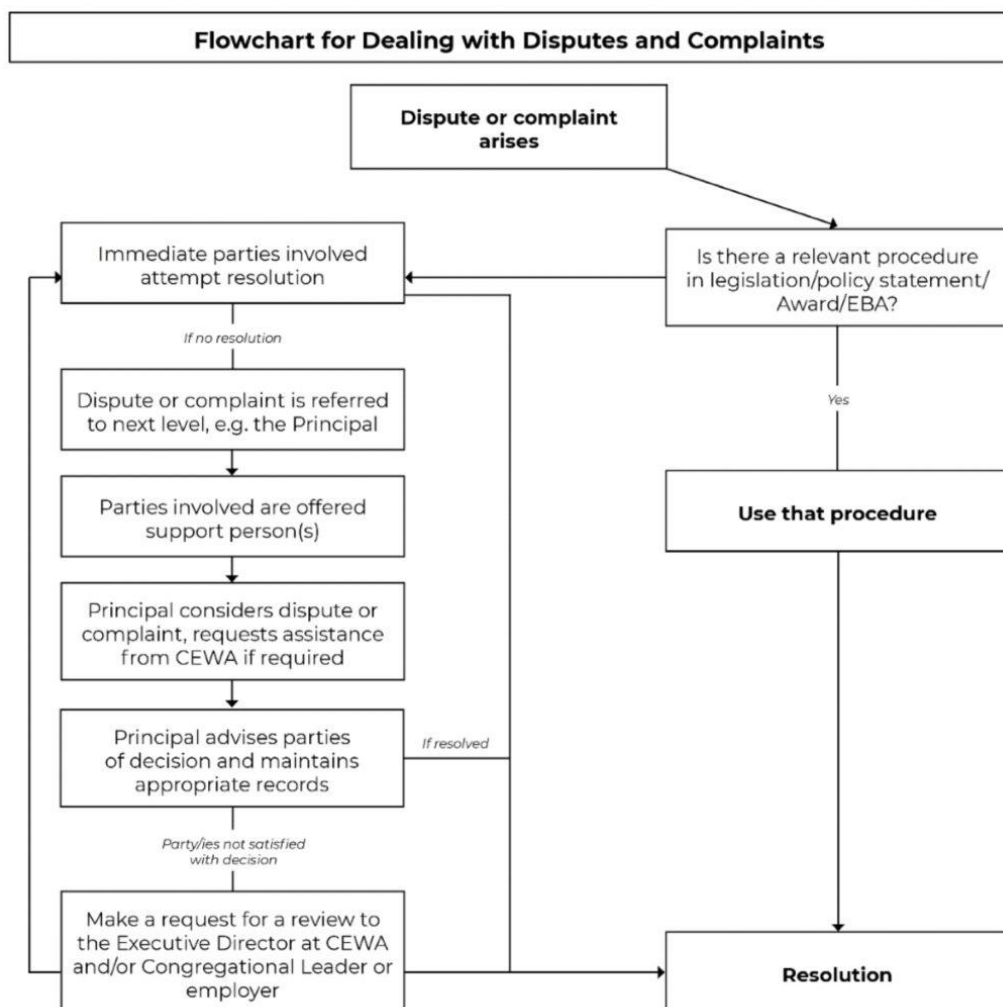
## **Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable**

May I express my sincere gratitude to all families who have attended to school fees in 2022. Our school relies on income from Federal and State Grants based on a per-capita formula and on income we receive from other sources. We operate as a not for profit organisation and aim to spend all our income accordingly while being mindful of future planning and obligations. We receive utility bills e.g. power, water, land rates and the like which must be paid. We must manage our school grounds, facilities and building maintenance and up-keep and plan for future developments. We also have our core business of education services to supply to families. This includes purchasing licences for copyright obligations, resources in general, books, stationery, the ever-increasing ICT costs and keeping our staff at the cutting edge of education through professional development. Staff wages generally account for approximately 75% of a school's income. So, it is a large and significant undertaking to manage the financial obligations of a school.

The St Lawrence Advisory Council support the principal in this function and the school's Financial Officer (Alica Mayo) provides the book-keeping and accounting support required to meet the arduous legal and financial obligations. I thank both the Advisory Council and Alica for their support in ensuring the sound financial standing of our school. I thank all community members for following through in meeting your requirements. If you have any outstanding fees, please finalise these accounts or make an appointment to discuss the matter with myself or Alica.

This hard work and commitment to St Lawrence helps keep our school not only in exceptional condition financially and physically but also maintains our outstanding achievements through our students and community in general.
