Sports Day: Our sports day will go ahead this year however, several restrictions in line with Government and CEWA requirements will need to be in place for this to occur. We must all abide by these requirements or the day would not be able to go ahead or would need to be cancelled if breaches occurred.

For parents to enter school or attend events held by the school, the Principal's permission must be granted, and teacher invitation must be given. I grant permission and the teachers offer the invitation to attend the Sports Carnival provided the restrictions highlighted below are strictly followed by all individuals.

As this is an event the school is holding, we must all abide by the requirements. Breaches of these requirements would put the school in a very precarious and hazardous set of circumstances. I, as Principal, take responsibility that we will all abide by these restrictions and accordingly follow the Governments and CEWA's mandated precautions. I therefore ask that each one of you who intend to take up the invitation to attend this event follow all these requirements.

I would be loathed to be put into the situation of cancelling the event on the day because people could not or would not follow these requirements. As Principal I would be obligated to put into action what was required of me to keep the school in line with requirements and ensure the safety of all children, staff and community members. I feel certain with the wonderful community spirit that St Lawrence has and the outstanding way each member has followed all the school's previous restrictions and requirements, that this event will be a resounding success and all who attend will enjoy the day. Thank you all in advance for your support and understanding of the circumstances that require these actions. I really do value and appreciate how wonderfully supportive you all have been of the school during these unprecedented times.

Physical distancing requirements for students (regardless of age) is not mandatory, thus students can be seated together. However physical distancing between adults from different family groups and school staff is mandatory. Members from the same family may be seated together with no physical distancing between individuals. However, a 1.5 metre 'bubble' should be planned around each person/family group. If your family are planning to attend, they may seat near each other, but distance MUST be maintained between different family groups.

Children must remain in bays this year and parents are NOT to enter the bay areas. This includes parents bringing lunch to the bays for their children.

All children must bring their own personal water bottle.

Sanitising stations will be located around the oval and all are asked to follow the correct sanitising procedures.

Portable toilets have been organised for parents attending the carnival. These will be located on the oval for your convenience.

Again, I thank you for your support in ensuring the event is a fun and enjoyable celebration of our wonderful students.

Parking:

As there will be a funeral at St Lawrence Church on Friday, the Balcatta Soccer Oval carpark in Albert Street will be opened to provide extra parking.

Catholic Schools of Excellence

All Catholic Schools have a Code of Conduct and all staff, parents, visitors and children must abide by the code.

Purpose

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to describe minimum standards of conduct in all behaviour and decision making to ensure the safety and well-being of students.

Application

The Code applies to staff, students, volunteers, parents and guardians as applicable. The term 'parents' includes guardians.

Introduction

You acknowledge the inherent vulnerability of the students in your care.

You recognise that the safety and well-being of students depends upon your vigilance and diligence and the vigilance and diligence of all adults.

The Code does not give you detailed professional advice on specific behaviour. Rather, it describes the minimum requirements expected of you.

The Guidelines are illustrative and not an exhaustive list of the behaviours covered by the Code.

If your behaviour varies from the standards described in this Code and Guidelines, you should be prepared to explain and justify your decisions and actions.

While mandatory language such as 'must', 'shall' and 'will' is not used throughout the Code, there is a presumption the conduct described is mandatory and therefore not discretionary.

The Principal expects you to conduct yourself personally and professionally in a way that maintains public trust and confidence in your school and the Church.

You have a responsibility to students and their family, other members of the school community and the wider community to provide and support safe and competent education and care of students.

You will do your best to support other members of the school community to comply with the Code.

In cases of conflict between parts of the Code, between the Code and other school policies, or in any decision-making choices, you give priority to the outcome that will be in the best interests of the safety and well-being of the child.

Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable

State-wide commitment to zero percent fee increases for 2021

Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) Executive Director Dr Debra Sayce has confirmed there will be no increase in tuition fees in 2021 at CEWA-owned schools throughout the State. "Western Australians have come together to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic and we are very grateful to Government for their continued support of Catholic Education in Western Australia." "Our schools have reported that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many parents and caregivers have lost their jobs or had their hours cut, making it difficult for some families to make ends meet," she says.

A survey of CEWA schools showed the number of families accessing fee relief through CEWA's Health Care Card Discount Scheme had risen significantly. By June 2020, \$23.4 million in fee relief had been accessed by Catholic school families, compared to \$21.5 million for the full 2019 school year.

The number of families seeking special fee concessions was also up. By June 2020 the value of fee concessions was quickly approaching the \$6.74 million total reached in 2019.

With one in five WA students enrolled at 163 Catholic schools in metropolitan, regional and remote communities, Catholic Education plays an important role in the lives of thousands of Western Australians.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has been upsetting and destabilising for many young people. Now, more than ever, every child in Western Australia deserves to feel supported and should have access to a great education regardless of what school they attend."

Catholic Education understands the need for families to have certainty and stability. That is why Catholic diocesan schools are providing families with the assurance that fees won't rise in 2021," she says.

While 14 non-diocesan Catholic schools have the autonomy to set their own fees, these schools share a commitment to minimising the impact of COVID-19 in their communities.

"Catholic schools are a part of every community and as WA's fourth biggest employer, Catholic Education supports more than 11,000 teaching and non-teaching jobs across WA, as well as creating employment in many local support sectors."

"Catholic Education is committed to supporting our State's COVID-19 recovery. Through these challenging times, the wellbeing and learning of students has been at the forefront of our decisions. Combining this focus with our emphasis on creating certainty around fees and ensuring job security for our staff, has helped to minimise the impact of COVID-19 in our school communities," *Dr Sayce concludes*.

LEARNING AT HOME TIPS

LOSING WELL

Children enjoy competing in contests like sporting events and sometimes there is a prize they really want to win. However, not everybody can win at once, and it can be very upsetting to a child when the inevitable time comes that they aren't the winner. Although it may seem impossible, there are ways to make them feel better about it.

- 1. Congratulate your child for competing in the first place. Tell them that you're impressed at how well they tried.
- 2. **Encourage them to congratulate the winner**. Remind them that whoever won is as happy about it as they would have been.
- 3. Reward them in some other way like taking them out for an ice cream or letting them pick the nights meal. While you don't want to spoil them, rewarding them for competing can be an effective way to show them that you still think they're a winner for having a go.

Things to avoid:

- Don't trivialise the situation by saying something like "it's just a game". That might help put things in perspective, but it doesn't help bruised feelings.
- Don't punish your child for being upset or accuse them of being a poor loser. Children just want to do well at everything they do. Let them work through their feelings and get over it.

Don't lose sight of the fact that it's not bad to lose. Losing teaches many valuable lessons. Everyone can't be a winner every time and children need to learn this. Helping them through a defeat will help them face the next challenge with confidence they can cope with the outcome.

SPORTS CARNIVAL



On Friday we have our sports carnival. Thank you to Mrs Major for all her hard work in preparing for the day. The children will take part in a range of individual and team events for their faction. Please be aware COVID-19 Phase 4 is still in place, so physical distancing is still essential. We have had to make several adjustments to comply with the requirements that we are expected to comply with regarding external events, in particular the 2 m2 expectation and physical distancing of adults at the carnival.

We appreciate that some may find these requirements challenging, but we are required to be proactive in how we are responding to each event held by the school.

For the event to take place all spectators need to adhere to the following requirements and restrictions.

- Please maintain a safe physical distance of 1.5m from other families
- Please do not attend this event if you feel unwell, have flu/respiratory symptoms, or an elevated temperature or if you have been in contact with another person who has been sick.
- Hand sanitiser will be provided. Please sanitise your hands when you enter the oval and during the carnival if necessary.
- Parents must remain in the viewing bays which will be fenced off. No adult other than a staff member may enter the student bays. Please do not enter the faction tents.
- Children are to eat their lunch in the bays.
- Portable toilets will be made available for parents and visitors throughout the day.
- No visitors are to enter the school building. Students will use the school toilets.
- Children will not be able to sit with their parents at lunch time this year as they have done in previous years.








CLASS NEWS

Buon lavoro (enjoy your work) e buon divertimento (have fun) for the rest of September and October.






