The vision of St Lawrence Catholic Primary School, Balcatta is to share the message of God's love and friendship in a community of learners, developing the full potential of each child.

The Angelus (Latin for "angel") is a Catholic devotion commemorating the Incarnation. As with many Catholic prayers, the name Angelus is derived from its opening words: Angelus Domini Nuntiavit Mariæ ("The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary") and is practised by reciting as versicle and response, three Biblical verses narrating the mystery, alternating with the prayer "Hail Mary".

The devotion was traditionally recited in Roman Catholic churches, convents, and monasteries three times daily: 6:00am, noon, and 6:00pm (many churches still follow the devotion, and some families continue the practice at home). The Angelus is usually accompanied by the ringing of the Angelus bell, which is a call to prayer and to spread goodwill to everyone. In our own Parish, the Angelus bell sounds every day at 12:00pm.

Pour forth, we beseech You, O Lord, Your Grace into our hearts; that as we have known the incarnation of Christ, your Son by the message of an angel, so by His passion and cross we may be brought to the glory of His Resurrection. Through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders.

The Leadership structure of St Lawrence is a simple model but one that works exceptionally well. A Principal is appointed by The Bishops of the Diocesan after Catholic Education Western Australia Ltd follows a recruitment and appointment process. Consultation with the school community, parish, and CEWA leads to a round of applications, interviews, and selection for recommendation to the Bishop for appointment. This model applies to all diocesan accountable schools. The Principal works closely with the Parish Priest to build community and support the families in the Faith education of their children. Generally, two Assistant Principals are appointed to share the leadership and support and assist the Principal.

In this task, I am ably supported by Gaby Brennan and Kathleen Tranquille. Both experienced and well-regarded leaders within our Catholic system. Together we work closely to ensure the school is a flourishing environment and meeting the compliance obligations of Federal, State, and Local Government and The Bishops' Mandate.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS

SCHOOL UNIFORM - ACCESSORIES

It is recommended that no jewellery be worn at school for safety and security reasons. Children are permitted to wear:

- A watch, including smart watches, is permitted. Nonetheless, parents are requested to disable any functions on the watch that enable its use for purposes other than timekeeping while the student is at school. If a student uses it for any other purpose, it is treated the same as a mobile phone and must be surrendered to the front office in accordance with the Mobile Phone Procedure. Smart watches must have School Mode activated before entering the school premises.
- A cross or Christian medal tucked under the shirt/blouse/dress is acceptable.
- Only one pair of sleepers (small plain) or studs (small gold or silver) is permitted.
- A Medic Alert bracelet.

CHILDREN MUST NOT BE ON THE SCHOOL SITE PRIOR TO 8.15AM.

Classroom teacher supervision begins at 8.30am when classrooms are opened. Children should arrive at school in good time so that they have ten minutes to prepare for the day, order lunches, and unpack bags. Children should go immediately to their classroom when they arrive at school after 8.30am and not leave the classroom without the teacher's permission. Teacher supervision concludes at 3.15pm each day.

Children must not play games, use sport equipment, use iPads, or be on playground equipment before or after school.

MORNING DROP OFF (Driver must stay in the car)

1. Vehicles are to enter the netball courts near the church and exit the netball courts near the school.

2. Drop Off:

- a. Enter via **IN** ramp.
- b. Continue driving on the netball court to the far end outside Year 1 classroom.
- c. **Drop off** passengers to lawn area in front of the Administration Block.
- d. Depart via **OUT** ramp onto Albert Street.

AFTERNOON PICKUP (Driver must stay in the car)

1. Pickup area for Families whose surname starts with A-K (Administration Pick Up)

- Enter via IN ramp KEEP RIGHT.
- Continue driving on the netball court to the far end outside Year 1 classroom.
- **Pick up** passengers from in front of the Administration Block.
- Depart via **OUT** ramp onto Albert Street.
- 2. Pickup area for Families whose surname starts with L– Z (Church Pick Up)
 - Enter via **IN** ramp **KEEP LEFT**.
 - Continue **UP** the ramp to the oval level.
 - Proceed to the front of the church.
 - **Pick up** passengers from the lawn area.
 - Exit via driveway between the Church and the Alverna Centre.

The speed limit within the carpark is 5-10km/hour.

3. Parents wishing to park or leave their vehicle:

- Enter via **IN** ramp.
- Park either against fence near church or in TWO rows in the middle of the Netball Courts. (Please minimise gaps in between cars so maximum number of cars can park).
- The netball area near the fence outside the Year 1 classroom must be left free for traffic flow.
- The driver must leave the vehicle as NO child is allowed onto the Netball court between 2.55pm 3.30pm unless accompanied by an adult.
- **4.** People who arrive early at St Lawrence (before 2.45pm) need to park their cars in the designated parking areas **AND NOT WAIT IN THE DRIVE THROUGH LANE.** This causes an unnecessary bank up of traffic, which then restricts access to the school grounds, blocks traffic on Albert Street, and creates a "grid-lock" situation.
- **5.** Avoid illegal acts such as double parking, parking on footpaths, or unsafe practices such as stopping in the traffic flow areas, which will endanger your child/children. Father has asked that parents refrain from parking near the front of the Church as parishioners who attend morning Mass need clear access.
- 6. Be on the alert for children who may not be looking for moving vehicles.

7. If your child is going home with another family, they are to wait with the children from that family.



It is great to see more and more children riding their bicycles to school. On the recommendation of safety authorities, we have a policy that only children 10 years and above are permitted to ride to school without a supervising adult. Riders must wear an approved safety helmet and keep to the bike paths.

Bikes should be parked in the bike racks and chained for security and helmets secured to bikes. Children must walk bicycles in the school grounds.

STUDENT IPAD AGREEMENT

The school's One-to-One iPad Program affords the opportunity for our students to enter a new world of curriculum possibilities, allowing engagement and involvement in their learning. All parents and students from year 3 to year 6 involved in the One-to-One program must read the student iPad Agreement carefully with their child. After your child has a thorough understanding of the school's expectations, with regard to iPad usage at St Lawrence, please sign the document and bring it back to school. By signing, you are indicating that you have read, understood and accept the student/parent participation agreement.
