Catholic Schools of Excellence

COVID-19 Update: I sincerely thank all community members for working with the school to support all our undertakings to meet the current restrictions, procedures and protocols that are required. Western Australia remains in a "State of Emergency"

The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on 11 March 2020. On 15 March 2020, the Minister for Emergency Services declared a state of emergency with effect from 12 a.m. on 16 March 2020 in respect of the pandemic caused by COVID-19 pursuant to section 56 of the *Emergency Management Act 2005* (WA) (**Act**) (**State of Emergency**). The State of Emergency applies to the State of Western Australia.

Furthermore the School is considered private property being owned by The Most Reverend Timothy Costelloe SDB Archbishop of Perth. Accordingly I must abide by any extra requirements placed on the school by the rightful owner.

All actions are taken for the safety of our community members. I appreciate the difficulties some restriction might cause some individuals, however community safety remains the paramount undertaking at this time. So again, a sincere thank you to each and every one of you for your understanding and support.

Moving forward we will continue to respond to the changing landscape and move as rapidly as is possible to navigate changes smoothly and effectively.

A number of our usual Term One events will be impacted.

- Shrove Tuesday we are unable to supply cooked pancakes this year
- Restrictions to community members may still apply to the Ash Wednesday Mass
- The Welcome Back Picnic will not be taking place
- Parent Teacher nights are not able to go forward however all documentation will be sent to all families.

Catholic Pastoral Communities

I include a few very quick reminders for all members of our community.

- We will be keeping our drop off and pick up procedures as we did in last year's response to COVID-19. Parents have greatly appreciated the current process and we will endeavour to keep it accordingly.
- Please be very careful when dropping off and picking up children and always follow the correct parking procedures.
- Utmost care should be taken at all times when operating vehicles on school premises.
- Children generally do not require a mobile phone (or similar device) at primary school. However, if there is a request for one please speak directly to the Principal. If permission is granted, they must be stored in the school office area.
- Please ensure you register all absences with the school.
- Any change in contacts details or of a child's health status should be recorded with the teacher and office directly.

Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable

UNIFORMS: All students are to ensure that the summer uniform is worn correctly. It is important for all students to keep hair neat and tidy and that no jewellery is to be worn, except for a watch, one pair of studs or sleepers, a gold or silver necklace with a religious medallion or cross, kept tucked into shirt/dress. For girls, please ensure that hair accessories are kept to the school colours and appropriate. When wearing the sports uniform please ensure that sneakers are standard uniform sanctioned. It is imperative that we are in our correct school uniform. Thank you to all the wonderful families who always support our school by adhering to correct uniform policy.

HOME LEARNING

LIMITS ON TECHNOLOGY USE AT HOME

There is credible research linking heavy technology use with the surge in a number of concerns for our youth, including, depression and other mental health issues. Suggested limits:

- No phones or tablets in the bedroom at night; use real alarm clocks to wake up.
- No use of devices within an hour of bedtime; the blue light and psychological stimulation interferes with sleep.
- Device use should be significantly limited (Some research suggest no more than two hours of leisure time a day, plus legitimate use for homework.

Uniforms

Thank you to our parents for sending the children back to school smartly dressed in their summer uniforms. Please be reminded that the Uniform Shop is open on Wednesdays 8.30 am - 9.30 am and Thursdays 2.30 pm - 3.30 pm. The St Lawrence Primary School Uniform Policy can be located on our school website. Please find below an excerpt from the policy.

Uniform Requirements

School uniform is a sign of our community. It has been chosen by the community and all are expected to support it.

- Children are expected to be attired in the correct and complete school uniform at all times.
- Early Years: St Lawrence sports uniform is compulsory in Pre-Primary Pre Kindy and Kindergarten children are not required to wear school uniforms
- Summer uniform is worn by Years 1 to 6 in Term 1 and Term 4. Winter uniform is worn in Term 2 and Term 3.
- Children are to wear the school sports uniform on the days they have Physical Education or Sport. Black sports shoes should be appropriate for Physical Education and white school sports socks.
- Hair must be neat and tidy and tied back if shoulder length or longer or if hair falls about the face. Hair should be checked regularly by families to prevent lice infestation.
- Hair ties should be in the school colours only: Blue or white with the summer uniform and navy blue or white with the winter uniform. Gold or red with the sports uniform
- *Nail polish and make-up is not permitted.*
- If an accident or problem prevents children from wearing their full school uniform on any particular day, an explanation note must be sent to the school.
- "No hat, no play" School hats are part of the school uniform and must be worn every day.


I would like to have all deposits, into the office this week.
