Dear St Lawrence Primary School Community

I hope you had a blessed Easter with your family and are refreshed and ready for all Term 2 has in store for us.

During the school holidays, you would have received a notice from our Executive Director Debra Sayce that in the absence of Sheldon Carey, I will be joining the school community as Short Term Principal at the commencement of this term. I feel very privileged to be asked to support Gabrielle Brennan and Kathleen Tranquille to support the staff, students and community to ensure your school continues to thrive. You have a beautiful school. I will be on morning duty each day for the student's arrival and am excited to meet and work with you all.

I met Gabrielle and Kathleen during the school holidays for a briefing of priorities for the school over the coming few weeks. It is my aim and hope to provide you all a seamless transition into the new term and to provide support where it is needed. Thank you to both Gabrielle and Kathleen who successfully juggled many balls prior to the end of Term 1 and their welcoming support.

COVID-19 UPDATE

During the school holidays, the Premier announced on 13 April 2022 that the Western Australian close contact definition will now align with the National Cabinet's definition.

This means that a close contact is now defined as:

- a family or household member of a person with COVID-19 who has had contact with them during their infectious period.
- someone who has had close interaction with a person with COVID-19 during their infectious period, where they spent more than 4 hours with them in a single day, in a residential setting, including a boarding facility, where masks have not been worn; or
- someone who is directed by WA Health that they are a close contact.

Schools are no longer considered close contact venues. A child who attends class with a peer who later tests positive to COVID-19 will no longer be identified as a close contact. Any child who becomes symptomatic should stay home and be tested for COVID-19. Please continue to refer to healthywa.wa.gov.au for information on close contact definitions, testing and isolation requirements.

Any positive COVID-19 result should be reported on the school's COVID-19 Self-Reporting Portal and positive COVID-19 RAT results must also be reported on the WA Health RAT Register, as is required by the WA Government.

The easing of restrictions has meant some of our school activities can resume this term, including school camps. We will provide more information on the requirements and additional COVID-19 considerations for each activity as they arise on the school calendar.

Further to this update the Minister for Health, Hon Amber Jade-Sanderson announced on Tuesday 26 April that effective 12.01am, Friday 29 April 2022, public health measures in Western Australia will be eased to what is now being called 'baseline settings.

CEWA is working with the Department of Health and the Department of Education to determine the full implication for school operations, going forward. St Lawrence's Primary School Balcatta will follow CEWA's recommendation and adhere to current guidelines for the remainder of this week with the new Operating Guidelines coming into effect from Monday, 2 May 2022.

MAKING JESUS REAL - MJR

Yesterday the staff and I participated in Professional Development to strengthen the Making Jesus Real Program in our school. Jesus was kind, compassionate, patient, loving to name a few, and this is how we want to be. 

Unity - working in **harmony** with one another


Reconciliation

Winter Uniform

NAPLAN

A reminder that students in Year 3 and 5 will participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar, and punctuation) and numeracy. All the tests will be completed online except for the Year 3 writing test which will be a paper test.

The NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. However, NAPLAN is only one aspect of a schools reporting and assessment process. It does not replace ongoing assessments administered by teachers to determine student performance over time. Some helpful NAPLAN tips:

- Reinforce that your expectation is for them to try their best
- Maintain a caring and positive attitude
- Keep perspective This is just one test in time: just one form of assessment; success is not determined by one test
- Prepare your child Have your child go to bed early so they are well rested and make sure they have eaten a good breakfast.

COVID-19 Self-Reporting


Thank you to all the families who entered positive test results on the Self-Reporting Portal located on our school website over the course of the school holidays. If you have not entered this information please do so as soon as possible, doing so will allow for the Leadership Team to have a complete picture of students who have been COVID-19 positive and therefore who are no longer able to be determined as close contacts or deemed susceptible to the virus.

It is important to note that if parents are using the self-reporting portal to report a positive RAT result that they must also record the positive test result on the Healthy WA website.

Winter Uniform

Important note for Year 1 students and new students who have commenced this year:

GIRLS/BOYS

- Girls White Blouse is worn over their skirt (not tucked in).
- School Tie is required.
- Medium length usually for Year 1 to Year 3 and long length for Year 4 to Year 6.
- Jumpers or a school vest may be worn with school uniform only.
- Sports Track Jacket only to be worn with sports uniform
- Girls may wear navy tights with school uniform. Tights may be purchased at any department store
- Navy or white hair ties with school uniform.
- Boys blue shirt is worn for summer and winter uniform and must be tucked in school grey trousers.


