The feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated each year on the eighth of September. It is the custom of the church to celebrate the feast day of a saint on the date of their death as this is truly their "die natalis", the day remembered as their birth into everlasting happiness. Mary, however, entered this world sinless through the privilege of the Immaculate Conception and is the firstborn of the redeemed. Her nativity is a cause for great joy as it is considered the "dawn of our salvation" as Pope Paul VI wrote in the document, Marialis Cultus in 1972.

Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders

What a wonderful couple of celebrations we had last week. Our Mathematics Night had well of 65 attendees and what a night it was. Ben Saulsman, presenter from The Catholic Education Office, articulated some interesting insights into the Alpha Generation, **Generation Alpha** (or **Gen Alpha** for short) as the demographic cohort succeeding Generation Z. Researchers and popular media use the early to mid 2010s as starting birth years and the mid 2020s as ending birth years. Named after the first letter in the Greek alphabet, Generation Alpha is the first to be born entirely in the 21st century. Most members of Generation Alpha are the children of Millennials.

Generation theories can and do greatly impact the direction of education and the pedagogies that will be required to teach children of this cohort. Ben also walked us through the judging standards. *Judging standards* is a tool to support teachers when reporting against the achievement standards for each year of schooling; when giving assessment feedback; and when explaining the differences between one student's achievement and another's. The achievement standard describes an expected level that the majority of students are achieving or working towards by the end of that year of schooling. Some students will have progressed beyond the achievement standard; others will need additional support. The expected standard for each year is described as 'C' or Satisfactory.

As reporting student achievement in terms of grades is a broad classification of performance, each grade represents a wide range of student ability. Many students will be given the same grade in semester 1 and semester 2, even though their teachers will have observed growth in learning. Bearing in mind that work in Semester 2 builds on Semester 1, maintaining a grade indicates students have held their own in the face of more advanced material and in this way have grown in their learning'

I think all who attended would agree it was an exceptional learning experience and certainly provides us with a lot of information to digest.

Close on the heels of the Mathematics Night was The Father's Day Breakfast. What a huge turnout we had for this celebration. It was so joyous to see so many people back in the school and celebrating our wonderful community.

May I extend our sincere and heartfelt gratitude to our wonderful P&F, who organised the catering for both events. Their enthusiasm and dedication ensured the success of these events. Well done to all who helped and a huge thank you to those who generously donated to support these events.

Philosophical Questions



There is significant evidence that engaging in philosophical debate can have significant cognitive benefits for children, encouraging open-mindedness, rational thinking and developing the ability to articulate an argument. Here are a few questions you might like to discuss as a family to get you started:

- Can happiness exist without sadness?
- Why do we treat some animals better than others?
- Why is it so difficult to imagine a brand new colour that does not already exist?
- If you could make one rule that everyone in the world had to follow, what would it be?
- Can a person 'think' themselves happy?

These deeper philosophical questions can lead to very meaningful conversations within our families and certainly provide opportunity for the family to come together and talk, spend time together and enjoying the blessing of family time.

PRE-PRIMARY STUDENTS 2022


Pre-primary families were sent an email on Wednesday 31st August, regarding uniform requirements of students commencing Year 1, 2023.
