

Dear Parents & Guardians

Traditionally the Church each month has a special devotional focus. May and October are thought of as Marian months, where we spend extra time in prayer and strengthening our relationship with Jesus through Our Lady. We are blessed in many ways here at St Lawrence. One such blessing is the Church bell that chimes daily at 12:00 noon. This bell reminds us all to stop and ponder the love and devotion Mary had towards her most cherished Son, Jesus. This is a great opportunity for us all to spend a few moments in prayer, to stop, retreat from the hustle and bustle of the world and be at peace. The bell historically was a sign to say the Angelus, in fact the bell is often called "The Angelus Bell". A call to prayer and accordingly a call to spread goodwill to everyone. One of our most beloved and often recited devotional prayers is the Hail Mary.

I took a photograph of two of our Year 2 students who were on their way to the library. They had stopped to pray when they heard the Church bells ring at 12.00 noon.





The Hail Mary is the most familiar of all the prayers used by the Catholic Church in honour of our Blessed Lady. When we think of Mary, it would be easy to think of her as some divine being that was able to become perfect through some mystical gift, however, it is in understanding her as a human being with human limitations, that we truly recognise the power of her belief and faith in God. It is in her faith that she is blessed and holy and through such faith and humility, she became the perfect instrument of God's will and was the obedient and willing servant of God. Paintings of Mary often show her in blue. Blue was historically perceived to be a colour which was sacred and mystical as it was not a naturally occurring colour and was hard to get hold of. It was around the 5th Century that blue became the colour for Our Lady and has remained so ever since.

One million Children Praying the Rosary

Aid to the Church in Need invited us all to join the prayer campaign; One Million Children Praying the Rosary. Families, parishes, catechists and teachers were invited to pray together with children for peace and unity in the world. Our school took part in this wonderful initiative on Tuesday at the Church. 


YEAR 6 CONFIRMATION RETREAT


SECOND HAND BOOK SALE
