HOLIDAY READING TIP



It comes as no surprise that children love school holidays! Being free of the restraints of going to school every day and being able to relax is a valuable part of growing up. The regular reading that is a part of many children's school day suddenly comes to an end as there are far more interesting things to do on holiday than read a book, right?

Research clearly shows that when kids put down schoolbooks on their break, their reading ability also drops with it. The term "summer slide" is well established in the United States and refers to children dropping in their reading ability following a lack of reading over the summer break. Teachers in Australia also frequently report that students return to school after their break with a lower reading level and interest in books, than when they left previously. Therefore, it's vital that we continue to encourage our children to read widely and often whilst they are on holidays.

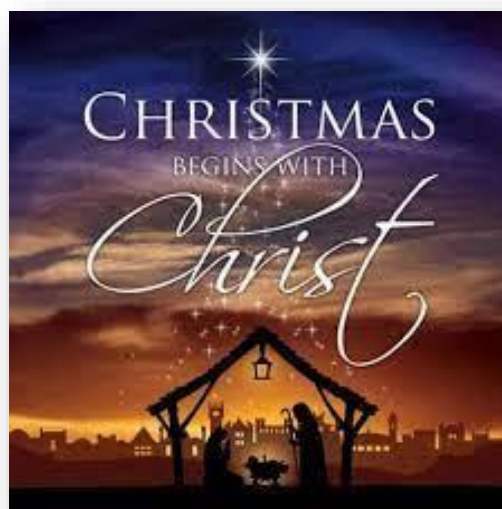
